SCHOOL REFORM ACT & NO CHILD LEFT BEHIND
SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT CYCLE

Listed below are the School Reform Act (SRA) and No Child Left Behind (NCLB) designations for schools that fail to make Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) in consecutive years. The timeline specified in the cycle below represents the fastest progression possible for schools that ended school year 2003-2004 without a Performance Warned, School Improvement or Corrective Action rating under the former state accountability system, but failed to make AYP beginning with the spring 2004 assessment.

Entering the cycle: Schools receive an SRA/NCLB designation of School Improvement I only after failing to make AYP for two consecutive years.

Delay provision: Schools with an SRA/NCLB designation that make AYP once remain in the same category for an additional year.

Removal from the cycle: Schools with an SRA/NCLB designation that make AYP for two consecutive years begin the process over again with no designation.

Proficiency goal: 100% of students will be proficient by the 2013-2014 school year.
