

Student Survey

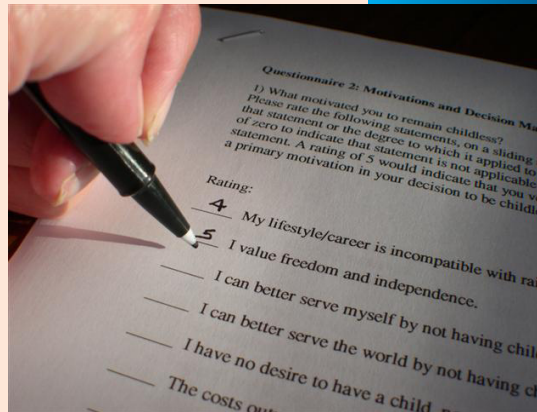
The school district is required to receive feedback for students who have received special education services one year after they graduate or reach the age ceiling from high school. It is important to inform your child to expect to be contacted by someone one year after leaving high school. The questions could come in the form of a written survey or telephone interview.

The questions will focus on whether the individual is now gainfully employed and/or involved in a post-secondary activity such as attending a university, college, or technical school.

The information gathered will be used to improve special education services.

State Performance Plan (SPP)



It is important for you to provide your feedback when receiving the survey. Your opinion counts and will make a difference for your child and other children across the State.

Introduction

The State Performance Plan (SPP) is a six year plan for the State to improve services and results for children and youth with disabilities. Think of the SPP as the IEP for the State.

Parents and students have an opportunity to express opinions regarding their experiences and involvement in the special education process.

The school district and State Education Department will use the information and data to improve programs and services for children and youth with disabilities.

Parent Survey

The Parent Survey is designed for parents who have a child with a disability who is receiving special education services. The survey usually consists of 25–30 questions regarding parent involvement in their child’s special education program. The following are ways school districts can disseminate the survey:

- Survey is mailed to parent with a SASE to return.
- Survey is given to the parent at an IEP Team Meeting
- Survey is completed “online” on the computer.

If you have not received a survey, call the school district special education office and ask for a copy. If you need help completing the survey, ask the school district for assistance.
